Metropolitan Planning Organizations

Kankakee Area Transportation Study is the metropolitan planning organization for the Kankakee Urbanized Area. By federal law, when an urban area reaches a population over 50,000, a metropolitan planning organization (MPO) is required to be established. The purpose of an MPO is to provide a comprehensive, cooperative, and continuing (3-C) planning process for surface transportation within the boundaries of the MPO.

The Kankakee Area Transportation Study Metropolitan Planning Organization was established in 1983, after the results of the 1980 decennial census determined the Kankakee Urbanized Area exceeded 50,000 people. The Kankakee Area Transportation Study is governed by a Policy Committee of elected and appointed members and is advised by a Technical Advisory Committee which is made up of technical personnel from each of the member agencies. Below are the member agencies of the Kankakee Area Transportation Study.

This Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is organized by the project category (public transportation, local highways, state highways, and non-motorized) and the year the project is currently expected to have the specified work done. The current fiscal year is called the annual element and the following three years of programming is called the multi-year element. Each project has been assigned a TIP number, shown in blue in the project description box. These TIP numbers are used by IDOT and FHWA for tracking purposes throughout the life of the project. All surface transportation projects programmed for the next four years, which use federal funds within the Metropolitan Planning Area Boundary are required to be included in this FY 2027-2030 Transportation Improvement Program.

Performance Measures

The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) integrated performance measures into the planning and programming aspects of transportation investment. MAP-21 established the following seven National Goals as the focus of the federal-aid highway program. The Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act and the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) provided for the continuation of these goals. Below each goal are the performance measures established by the Federal Highway Administration or the Federal Transit Administration as directed by IIJA.

1. Safety

To achieve a significant reduction in traffic fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads.
Measures:

Number of Fatalities

- Rate of Fatalities per 100 million VMT
- Number of Serious Injuries
- Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT
- Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries

While many of the performance measures for the national goals are continuing to be implemented and monitored, transportation safety was the first emphasis area to receive guidance, which addresses traffic fatalities and serious injuries. In August 2020, IDOT established the fourth set of highway safety targets (a two percent reduction for all performance measures) in the Illinois Highway Safety Plan and the KATS Policy Committee decided in February 2025 that KATS will continue to support IDOT in working toward those statewide targets. Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds have been programmed for projects listed in this document.

2. Infrastructure Condition

To maintain the highway infrastructure asset system in a state of good repair.

Measures:

- Percentage of NHS Bridges Classified as in Good Condition
- Percentage of NHS Bridges Classified as in Poor Condition
- Percentage of Pavements of the Interstate in Good Condition
- Percentage of Pavements of the Interstate in Poor Condition
- Percentage of Pavements of the non-Interstate NHS in Good Condition
- Percentage of Pavements of the non-Interstate NHS in Poor Condition

In addition to highway infrastructure state of good repair, there are transit asset management measures:

- Percentage of Equipment met or exceeded Useful Life Benchmark
- Percentage of Rolling Stock vehicles met or exceeded Useful Life Benchmark

- Percentage of Guideway Direction Route Miles with performance restrictions by class (not applicable to KATS)
- Percentage of Facilities with condition rating below 3.0 on FTA TERM Scale

The second set of performance measures (PM2) addresses the infrastructure condition. The performance targets of infrastructure condition pertain to the maintenance and improvement of pavement condition as well as bridge condition on the national highway system (NHS). IDOT set targets for infrastructure condition in September 2024, and the KATS Policy Committee decided to support those targets in October 2024.

3. Congestion Reduction

To achieve a significant reduction in congestion on the National Highway System.

Measures:

- Peak Hour Excessive Delay (PHED) Measure – Annual Hours of PHED per Capita (not applicable to KATS)
- Non-Single Occupancy Vehicle Travel (SOV) Measure – Percent of non-SOV Travel (not applicable to KATS)

4. System Reliability

To improve the efficiency of the surface transportation system.

Measures:

- Interstate Travel Time Reliability Measure – Percent of Person-Miles Traveled on the Interstate that are Reliable
- Non-Interstate NHS Travel Time Reliability Measure – Percent of Person-Miles Traveled on the non-Interstate NHS that are Reliable

5. Freight Movement and Economic Vitality

To improve the national freight network, strengthen the ability of rural communities to access national and international trade markets, and support regional economic development.

Measures:

- Freight Reliability Measure – Truck Travel Time Reliability (TTTR) Index

The third set of performance measures (PM3) addresses system performance. This includes system reliability and congestion reduction. The performance measures for system reliability pertain to the travel time reliability index for individuals and trucks. The performance measures for congestion reduction are tracked by monitoring air quality and only apply to air quality non-attainment areas. KATS is an attainment area; therefore, the air quality performance measures do not apply. IDOT set targets in September 2024 and the KATS Policy Committee decided to support those targets in October 2024. The baseline data from 2017 showed the KATS region already met all applicable statewide performance targets and is expected to maintain that

status. Federal National Highway Performance Program (NHPP) funds have been programmed for projects.

6. Environmental Sustainability

To enhance the performance of the transportation system while protecting and enhancing the natural environment.

Measures:

- Emissions Measure – Total Emissions Reduction (not applicable to KATS)

The fourth set of performance measures (PM4) addresses the reduction of greenhouse gases (GHG). On December 7, 2023, FHWA published a final rule amending 23 CFR 490, establishing a greenhouse gas (GHG) performance measure as part of Transportation Performance Kankakee Area Transportation Study FY 2025 Transportation Improvement Program Management. [23 CFR 490.105(c)(5)] [88 FR 85364] The GHG performance measure is the percent change in tailpipe Carbon Dioxide (CO₂) emissions on the National Highway System (NHS) compared to the reference year of calendar year 2022. [§ 490.507(b)]. Targets established for the GHG performance measure shall be declining targets for reducing tailpipe CO₂ emissions on the NHS. IDOT subsequently adopted a 2.6% reduction from 2022 to 2026. The KATS MPO is supporting this target.

7. Reduced Project Delivery Delays

To reduce project costs, promote jobs and the economy, and expedite the movement of people and goods by accelerating project completion through eliminating delays in the project development and delivery process, including reducing regulatory burdens and improving agencies' work practices.

8. Transit Asset Management and Transit Safety

The transit asset management performance measures establish targets for transit facilities, rolling stock, infrastructures, and equipment. The transit safety performance measures establish targets for fatalities, injuries, safety events, and system reliability. The KATS MPO elected to support the statewide targets included in the IDOT Statewide Tier 2 Transit Asset Management Plan in 2022 and will continue to support with the adoption of the 2026 plan.

The FAST Act requires projects programmed in the TIP to indicate how federally funded projects will help achieve performance targets. Each project in this document is denoted with a symbol to provide this information.



- Safety

Performance Measure Target Setting

The Performance Based Planning and Programming requirements require state DOTs, MPOs, and transit agencies to coordinate target setting for performance measures. MPOs must set their targets within 180 days of the state and transit agency targets. MPOs may choose to set their own targets or to program in support of the state and transit agency targets. KATS has decided to make this decision on a per-performance measure basis.

The IIJA requires a description of the anticipated effect of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) toward achieving performance targets. Per federal guidance, KATS has decided to support IDOT's performance targets for safety, pavement and bridge, system performance, and transit asset management. KATS will decide to adopt the respective state targets or set its own targets for the remaining performance measures as they are set by IDOT. As targets are set for the nationally prescribed performance measures, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan and TIP will be amended to address them during the first amendment to the TIP after the 180-day window.

All KATS adopted performance targets can be found in the most recent MTP.

Safety Measures

Currently, KATS is actively supporting all adopted targets through projects in the TIP for Program Years 2027-2030.

Alignment of TIP with Performance Measures

When selecting projects for inclusion in the TIP, several factors are considered, including a project's ability to help IDOT achieve their statewide targets. The projects included in the FY 2027-2030 TIP address these national measures, targets, and goals in a variety of ways. Programmed projects include ADA, pedestrian, and bicycle accommodations which add to the reduction of VMT per capita, increased modal balance, bicycle/pedestrian network completion, improve average commute and peak travel time, and maintaining acceptable air quality. The TIP includes numerous safety projects that address roadway and bicycle/pedestrian infrastructure, work-zone safety, and the safety and security of the transit system. These projects support a reduced crash rate and the improved condition of area roads and bridges. Many pavement improvements and railroad crossing improvements benefit these factors as well. Specific Safety projects have been programmed, though most projects address safety regardless of their funding source. Several roadways and intersections in the area suffer from congestion. These bottlenecks are addressed through capacity and efficiency improvements. The TIP continues to support the transit system as well, including technology projects that will improve transit operations. Coordination of service, with support for service outside of the MPO area, is also addressed. Transit State of Good Repair is provided by preventative

Staff Authority for Amendments to this Document

The Kankakee Area Transportation Study Policy Committee re-authorized staff to amend the **Transportation Improvement Program** (TIP) on August 17, 2016, meeting and expanded the authorization on March 27, 2019. The Policy Committee has authorized staff to modify the TIP under the following situations:

- An** existing TIP project requested to be placed in the current TIP year; or
- A** project update relating to Advance Construction (AC); or
- A** modification of project funding sources to non-federal funds; or
- A** decrease in project costs; or
- An** increase in project costs is less than ten percent of the current total project cost.

Any modifications performed by MPO staff will be reported at the next regularly scheduled meeting to advise the Technical Advisory and Policy Committee of the document changes.

Fiscal Year

The fiscal year used for the project listing in this document is the State of Illinois fiscal year, which runs from July 1 through June 30. It is understood that different fiscal years exist for every unit of local government, and for the federal funding from which the projects are funded, but the State of Illinois fiscal year will be used.

Operations and Maintenance

IDOT

There are 280.28 lane lines of state-maintained road within the KATS MPA. Maintenance costs include IDOT's salaries, materials and equipment needed to deliver the roadway and bridge maintenance programs. This category includes basic maintenance activities like minor surface treatments such as: sealing, small concrete repairs and pothole patching; mowing right of way; snow removal; replacing signs; striping; repairing guardrail; and repairing traffic signals. Performing these activities requires employees; vehicles and other machinery; and materials such as salt, asphalt and fuel.

IDOT District 3 utilizes Federal Funds to maintain roadways within the KATS system on a project-by-project basis. These projects are included as individual projects within the highway improvements element.

Local Jurisdictions

There are 803.54 local lane miles of road within the KATS MPA. Local revenue sources for operations and maintenance can include state fuel tax, state vehicles sales/use tax, local sales taxes, franchise fees, license and permit fees, property taxes, and other revenue sources that

provide significant resources for local general fund and specific funding of transportation. Not all taxes and fees go to transportation, so the local jurisdiction usually will identify a budget specifically for transportation purposes, such as capital improvements, Road and Bridge funds, transit operating subsidies, road and street budgets, or operations and maintenance budgets.

The operations and maintenance costs for local governments include salaries, fringe benefits, materials, and equipment needed to deliver the street and bridge maintenance programs. This category includes basic maintenance activities like minor surface treatments such as sealing, small concrete repairs, pothole patching, mowing, snow removal, replacing signs, striping, and repairing traffic signals. These activities may be performed in-house or outsourced. The table below shows the breakdown of Operations and Maintenance by local jurisdictions.

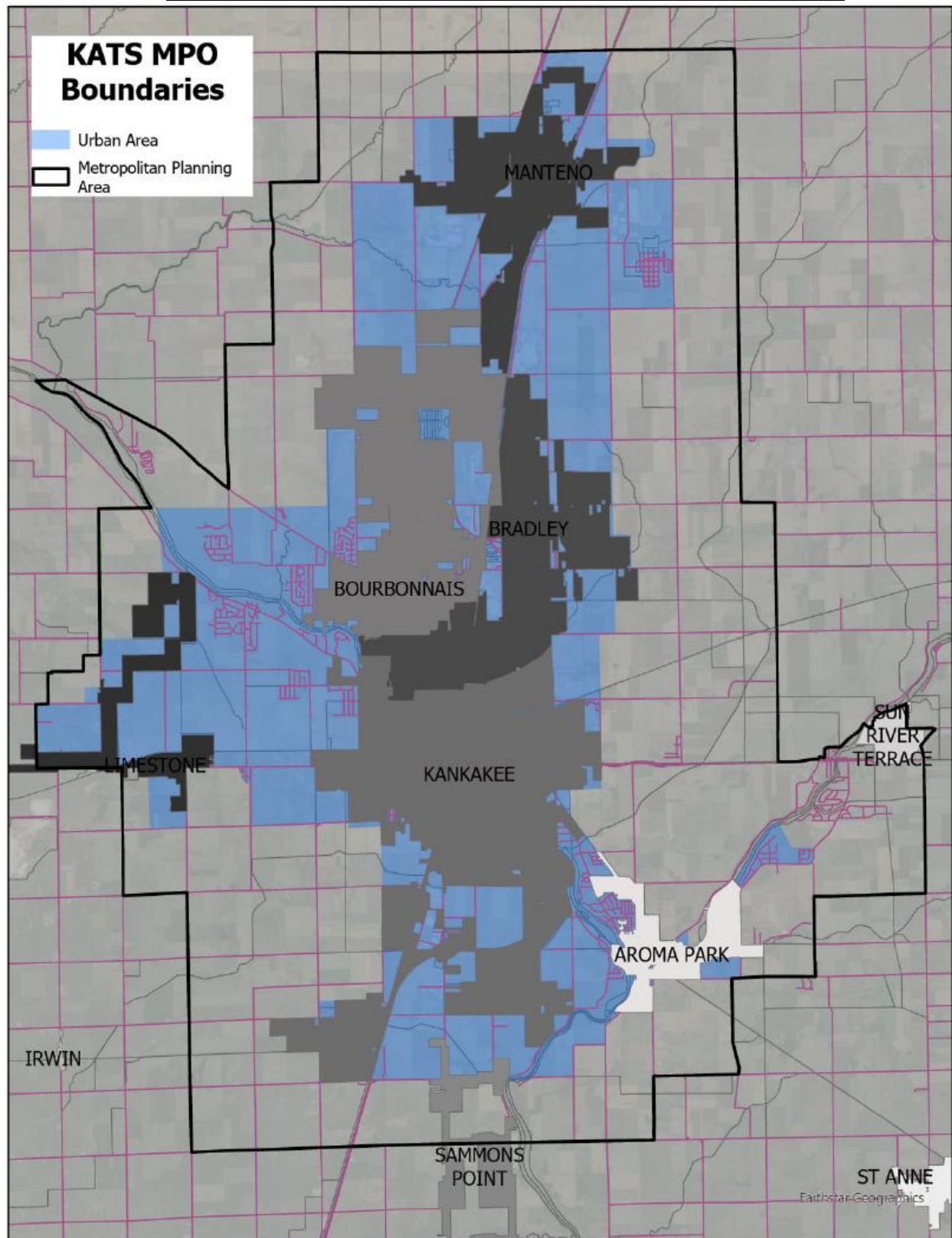
Obligated Projects

The current federal legislation regarding transportation, the Infrastructure and Investment Jobs Act, requires that an annual list of projects which were obligated in the previous program year be shown in the Transportation Improvement Program document. At a minimum, this list should contain:

1. The project name and brief description;
2. The federal amount obligated;
3. The total project cost estimate;
4. The project sponsor; and
5. "Visualization" of the project(s).

MPO Boundaries

The map on the previous page shows the current Census Urbanized Area Boundary (UZA) and the Adjusted Census Urbanized Area Boundary (UZB) of the Kankakee Area Transportation Study. The adjusted urbanized boundary is based off the official Census 2020 Urbanized Area Boundary (UZA) and rounded to better fit geographic features and municipal and political boundaries.

Also shown on the maps is the 2050 Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) Boundary, which is included in the Long-Range Transportation Plan as the area reasonably expected to become urbanized by the year 2050. All surface transportation projects programmed for the next four years, which use federal funds within the Metropolitan Planning Area Boundary are required to be included in the FY 2027-2030 Transportation Improvement Program. Both the Urbanized Area Boundary and the Metropolitan Planning Area Boundary were updated and approved in 2024 after the 2020 Census was completed. Updated boundaries will be created after the 2030 Census data becomes available.

**RESOLUTION OF THE POLICY COMMITTEE ADOPTING PROCEDURES AND
ALLOCATION LIMITS FOR SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM-URBAN
(STPU) FUNDING**

WHEREAS the Federal Highway Act of 1962, as amended, and the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, provides for an urban transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS the Kankakee Area Transportation Study (KATS) is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Kankakee Urbanized Area, and the Policy Committee has the specific responsibility to direct and administer the continuing urban transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS there has become a need to codify the procedures surrounding project selection; and

WHEREAS part of the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) development, KATS staff created a project evaluation tool to help the KATS Policy Committee prioritize transportation improvements (Exhibit A); and

WHEREAS part of the LRTP development the KATS Policy Committee directed staff to score proposed projects and prepare a list (Exhibit B), which maybe be amended from time to time, in which each project was placed into one of three (3) tiers and that Tier 1 projects had the highest scores, were fiscally constrained, and were determined to be of highest priority, promote the requirements of the FAST Act, and help achieve performance targets, and

WHEREAS a project will be defined as shovel ready when the sponsoring community has completed final engineering and other design plans and specifications, secure all necessary easements and right-of-way, and prepare a detailed engineer's opinion of cost and has adopted a resolution of support and commitment of funds for the necessary local match; and

WHEREAS to ensure projects are constructed in a timely manner, the local jurisdiction will be responsible for completing final engineering and other design plans and

specifications, secure all necessary easements and right-of-way, and prepare a detailed engineer's opinion of cost prior to the use of KATS MPO STBG-Urban funds; and

WHEREAS due to the consistent and common increase in project costs over time it is in the best interest of the KATS MPO to limit the total funds allocated to each individual project; and

WHEREAS additional detail is required when local project Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) sheets are submitted to staff for review and inclusion into the published TIP document; and

WHEREAS the Policy Committee is cognizant of the influence of external forces and maintains the right by vote to allocate additional funds to projects.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE KATS POLICY COMMITTEE

Section 1. That the attached project evaluation tool (Exhibit A) be maintained by KATS staff for consistency to meet current policies and priorities of the KATS Policy Committee and Illinois Department of Transportation and Federal Highway Administration performance measures. The scoring criteria will be evaluated annually by KATS staff and may be revised by action of the KATS Policy Committee, as required.

Section 2. That the cost of all design phases of engineering and other design, legal, and administrative services be entirely borne by the local agency or other source and will not be eligible for the STBG-U funds programmed by the KATS MPO program.

Section 3. That at the time of this resolution an appropriate funding level for individual projects shall be limited to lesser of the current applicable fiscal year allocation and the 3 preceding fiscal years of STPU allocation or 80% of the eligible project costs.

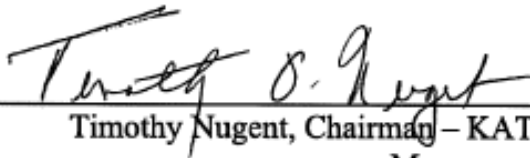
Section 4. That a list of projects will be maintained by KATS staff for consistency with the current, project evaluation tool and projects funded will be selected from Tier 1 of the project evaluation table with highest scoring project being given priority. In the event the highest scoring project is not ready to utilize STBG-U funds, the next scoring project will move forward for funding.

Section 5. That for shovel ready projects requesting STPU funds programmed by KATS MPO, a preliminary engineering plan and preliminary engineer's opinion of cost including all project elements be included when submitting a TIP sheet to KATS staff. These documents will be reviewed by KATS Technical Committee along with the TIP sheet and considered by the KATS Policy Committee for inclusion in the Transportation Improvement Program.

Section 6. That this committee acknowledges the need for flexibility when allocating STPU funds. In the event the KATS Policy Committee a project is moved between tiers, a simple majority vote of members or designated proxies of the KATS MPO Policy Committee is required.

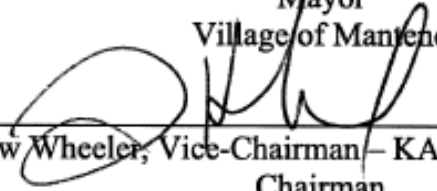

Public Transportation Improvement Projects



Public Transit Operators

This section of the TIP includes the two public transit programs operating within portions of the Kankakee Urbanized Area. Urban public transit is provided by River Valley **METRO** Mass Transit District, which receives funds from three main sources. Those funding sources are Federal Transit Administration Section 5307, the Downstate Operating Assistance Program from the State of Illinois, and local matching funds. A rural public transit service, administered by Kankakee County and operated through their service provider, SHOW BUS, operates with Section 5311 funding from the Federal Transit Administration, Downstate Operating Assistance Program funding from the State of Illinois, and local matching funds.

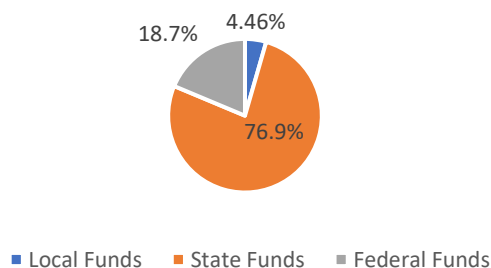
Both services obtain capital funding assistance through the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Illinois Department of Transportation, with the rural service utilizing FTA Section 5311 funding, and the urban service using FTA Section 5307 funding. The public involvement for the TIP is being used to satisfy Section 5307 public involvement requirements. Discretionary capital funding is available to the urban service through the use of FTA Section 5309 funds.

On the following pages, Kankakee County Rural Transit projects are shown with gray shading to differentiate between urban and rural projects more easily. TIP Numbers have been assigned to each project shown in blue in the project description box. These TIP Numbers are used by IDOT and FHWA for tracking purposes throughout the life of the project.

Project Programming

Included in this Transportation Improvement Program are all the surface transportation projects within the KATS metropolitan planning area that use federal funds. The projects included in the program are the outputs based on the availability of funds, the identification of transportation priorities and needs, and the expectation of achieving system performance goals. Projects that are programmed by KATS, using FHWA Surface Transportation Block Grant – Urban funds are consistent with the KATS 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan, which was adopted by the KATS Policy Committee on May 6, 2025.

Phases of Highway Projects

All highway projects, large and small, start with an idea or plan and end with construction. Listed below are the steps.

Scoping: Meetings are held with project developers and designers, local government representatives, and other involved parties. Decisions are made about the specific elements that will be included in the project, and the range of design alternatives that will be investigated.

Preliminary Design: This phase includes basic engineering work on each alternative, traffic studies, environmental analyses, and other work specific to the project. Public outreach is used to gain community input into project design. This phase ends with the selection and approval of a project alternative.

Final Design: In this phase, the actual plans and specifications that the construction contractor will work from are created.

Right of Way Incidentals: Preparation work done prior to the acquisition of the right-of-way.

Right of Way Acquisition: In this phase, right-of-way necessary for the completion of the project is acquired either through purchase or easements.

Construction: This encompasses all of the work to build the project, whether it is done by a contractor or an agency's own staff.

Construction Inspection: In order to make sure that the work is being done properly and conforms to specifications, there is ongoing inspection. Sometimes this work is performed by local or state agency staff, but it may be contracted out.

Other: This phase is associated with transit projects and corresponds to the construction phase of the highway improvements, in that it represents that phase of the project wherein the proposed improvement is actually implemented. For transit projects, this usually involves the actual operation of transit service, and the resultant costs that are incurred, or the purchase and acquisition of equipment or facilities.

Advanced Construction: This is a technique that allows a state to initiate a project using non-federal funds while preserving eligibility for future federal-aid funds. After an advance

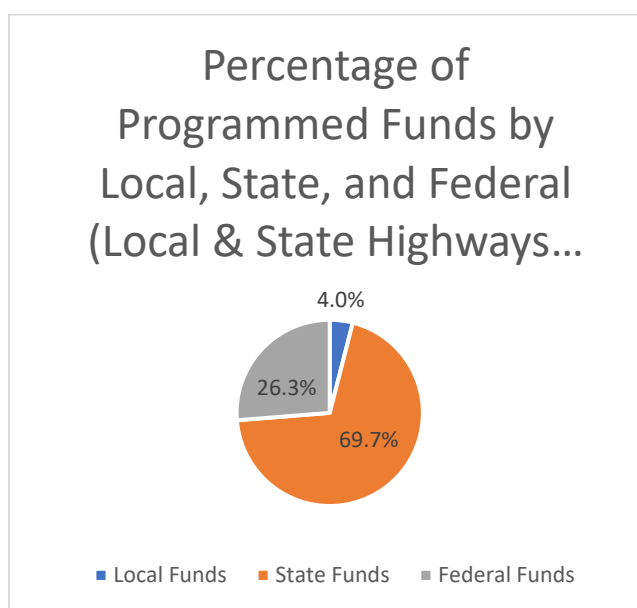
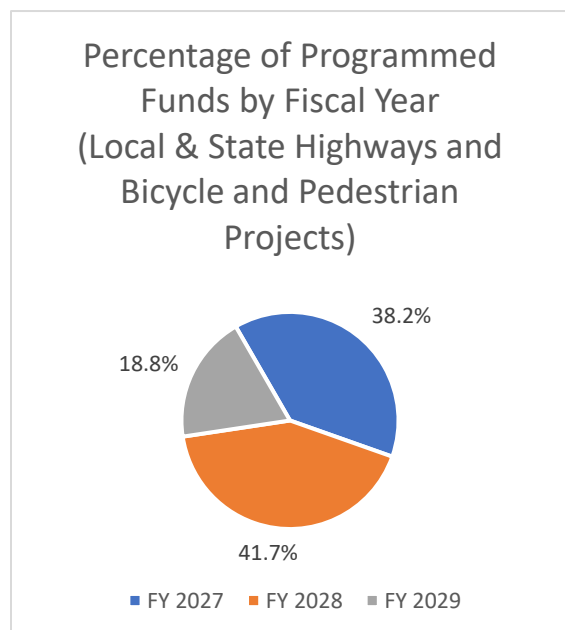
construction project is authorized, the state may convert the project to regular federal-aid funding provided federal funds are made available for the project. This is used in anticipation of future federal funds.

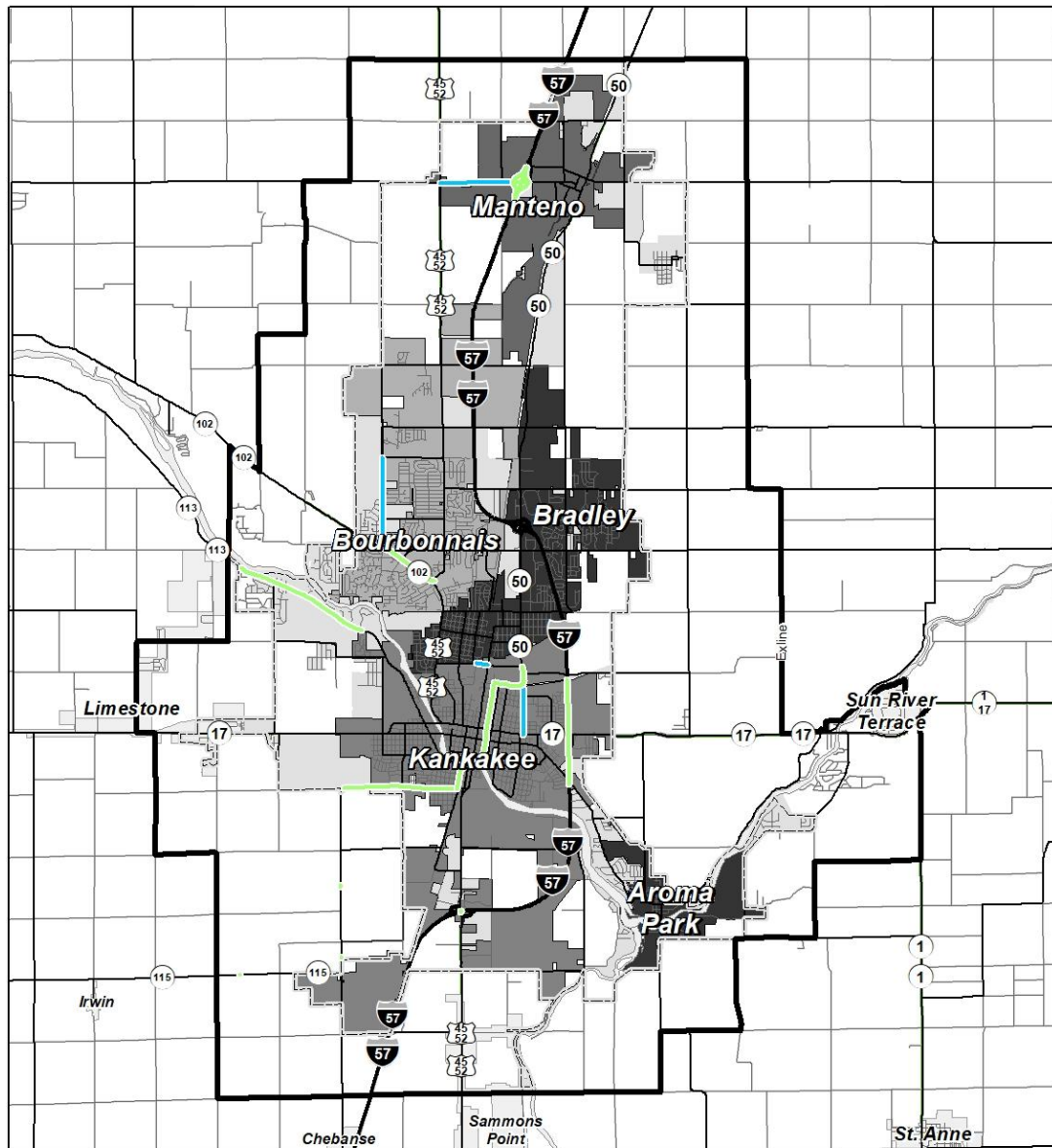


FY 2027 – 2030 Highway and Bicycle and Pedestrian Project Location Map

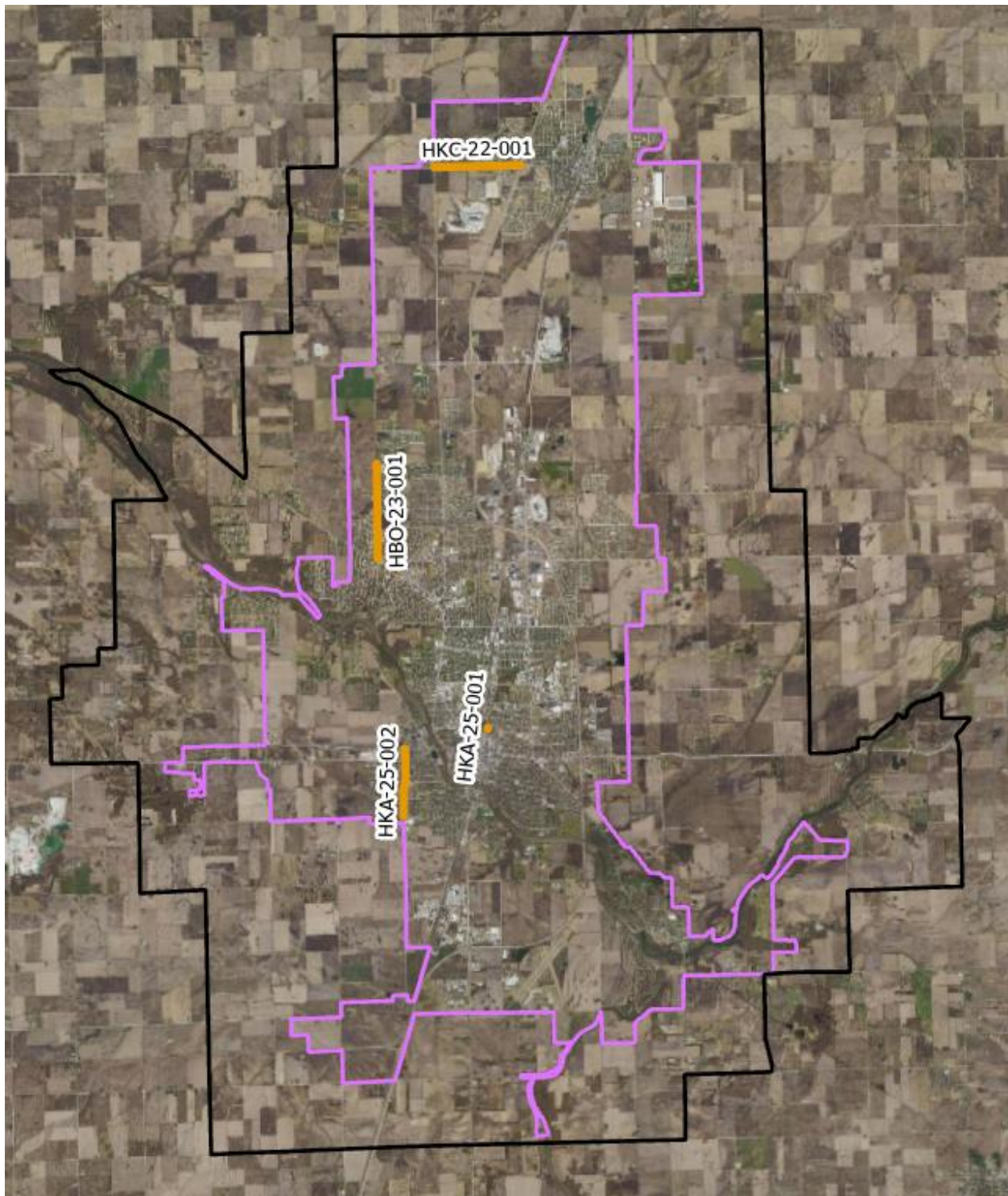

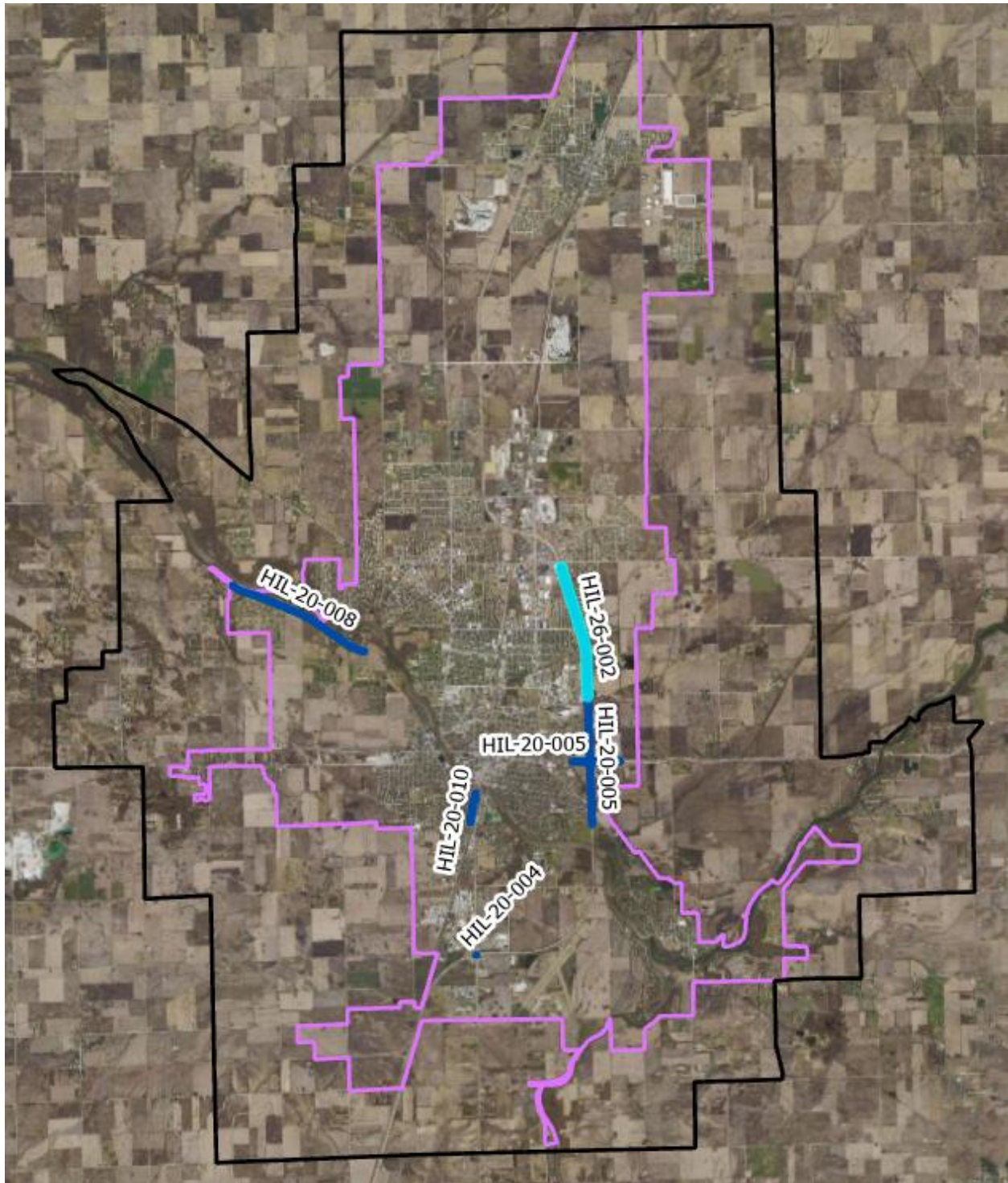

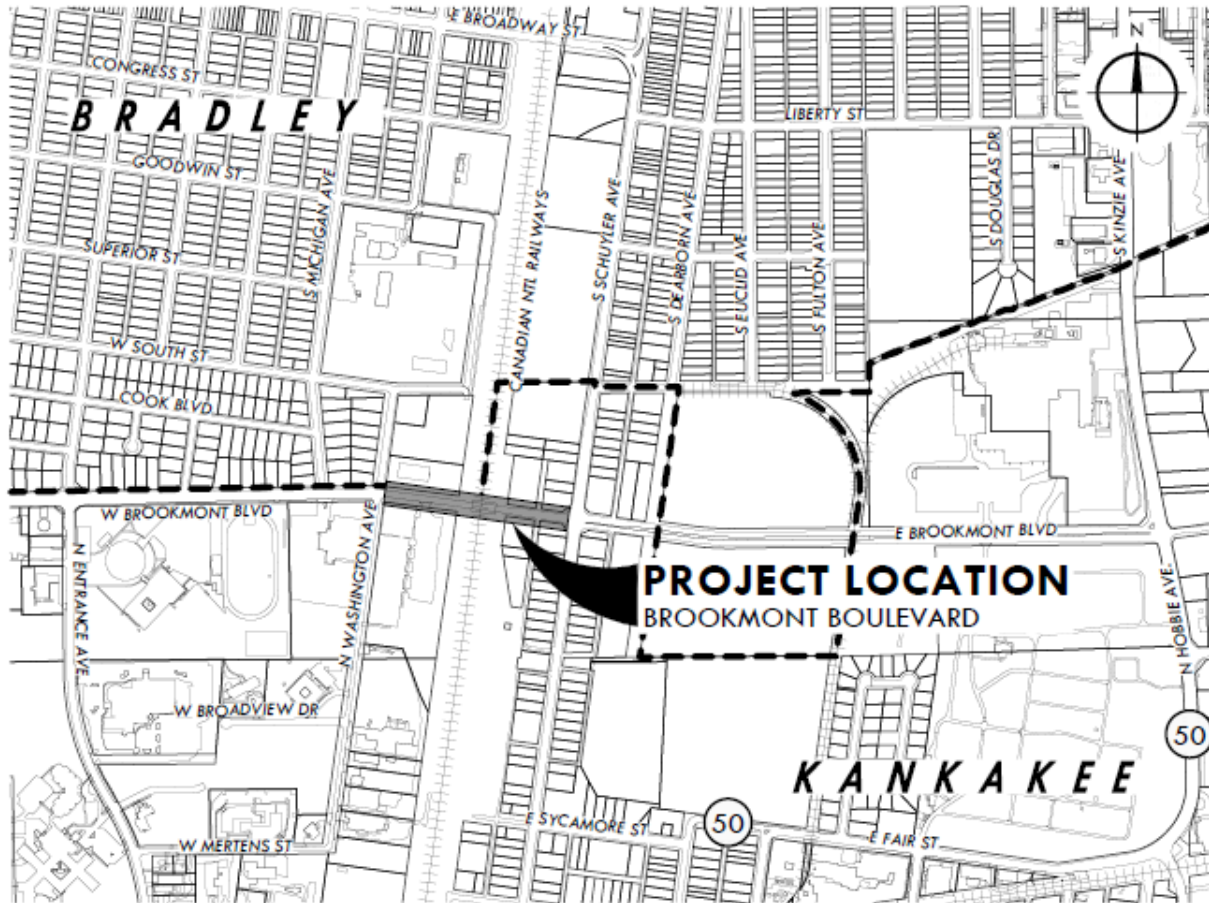

Attached to this Circular Letter is a listing of the state fiscal year (FY) 2027 federal Surface Transportation Program (STP), Local Bridge Formula Program (LBFP), and State Matching Assistance Program allotments. The federal formula allotments have been divided into STP-Rural (STR), STP-Urban (STU), and Local Bridge Formula Program (LBFP) categories, which are summarized as follows:

STP-Rural (STR):

The total amount of FY 2027 STR funds allotted to the counties is \$79,860,242 with \$71,227,901 to be distributed among the counties in Districts 2 through 9. The remaining \$8,632,341 is for use by the eligible counties in District 1.

The formula for distribution of the STR funds to the downstate counties is as follows:

1. Ten percent divided equally among the downstate counties.
2. Balance allocated to the downstate counties based on the following three factors with equal weight being given to each factor:
 - a. non-urban area
 - b. non-urban population
 - c. non-urban mileage (total all systems)

STP-Urban (STU):

The total amount of FY 2027 STU funds allotted to the urbanized areas is \$275,712,778 with \$227,109,192 to be utilized in District 1 for Northeastern Illinois. The remaining \$48,603,586 is for utilization by Districts 2 through 9 urbanized areas with a population greater than 5,000. The STU funds are sub-allocated to the urbanized areas based on percentage of population of the individual urbanized area to the total urbanized area population for the entire state.

Local Bridge Formula Program (LBFP, formerly STP-Br):

The total amount of FY 2027 Local Bridge Formula Program funds allotted to all counties is \$62,748,180. The funding is distributed based on the combined deficient square footage of eligible county, township, and municipal structures within a county.

Requests for local agencies to use the LBFP funds are to be made through the County Engineer with the approval of the IDOT District. Municipalities with a population of 15,000 or greater may program the funds directly through the IDOT District, with the amount coming from the total county allotment.

Distribution Data:

This year's federal funding allotments uses the 2020 census and urban areas, including any population updates received from the Secretary of State's office, and the 2024 Illinois Highway and Street Mileage Statistics non-urban mileage and non-urban area totals.

State Matching Assistance (SMA):

The formula for distribution of the \$6,720,000 in State Matching Assistance is based on 68 percent federal funding and 32 percent local match. This match ratio is variable each year and is generated to result in utilization of the entire state matching assistance amount. A more detailed explanation of the state matching assistance program is also attached.

Two amendments to the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) have been submitted: one by the City of Kankakee (HKA-16-041 Hobbie Ave: IL-17 (Court St.) to IL-50 (Fair St.) and one by the Village of Bourbonnais (HBO-23-001 Career Center: IL-102 (NW Main St.) to Burns Road).

Hobbie Avenue:

Change in cost of construction and updated letting information for HKA-16-041 Hobbie Ave: IL-17 (Court St.) to IL-50 (Fair St.). Project costs increased of \$1,034,995 from \$6,750,000 to \$7,784,995. Additional funds include \$340,430 in GCPF and local agency funds. No change in KATS STU funds. The updated tip sheet also reflects a project bid letting date of 9/23/22.

Career Center Road:

The amendment is to add Career Center: IL-102 (NW Main St.) to Burns Road) to the TIP. This project consists of constructing 7700 LF of an urban 3 lane roadway with separate 10 feet wide multi-use path. Traffic control and geometric improvements shall be provided at intersections as warranted. Improvements will include storm sewer and other related drainage improvements. The total project cost is \$6,050,000. The federal portion of programmed funds is Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urban (STBG-U) funds for \$4,000,000 and a local match from the Village of Bourbonnais for \$2,050,000.

Attached to the memo are draft TIP pages that include the aforementioned amendment, which will be presented to the KATS Technical Advisory Committee and Policy Committee on August 30, 2022. 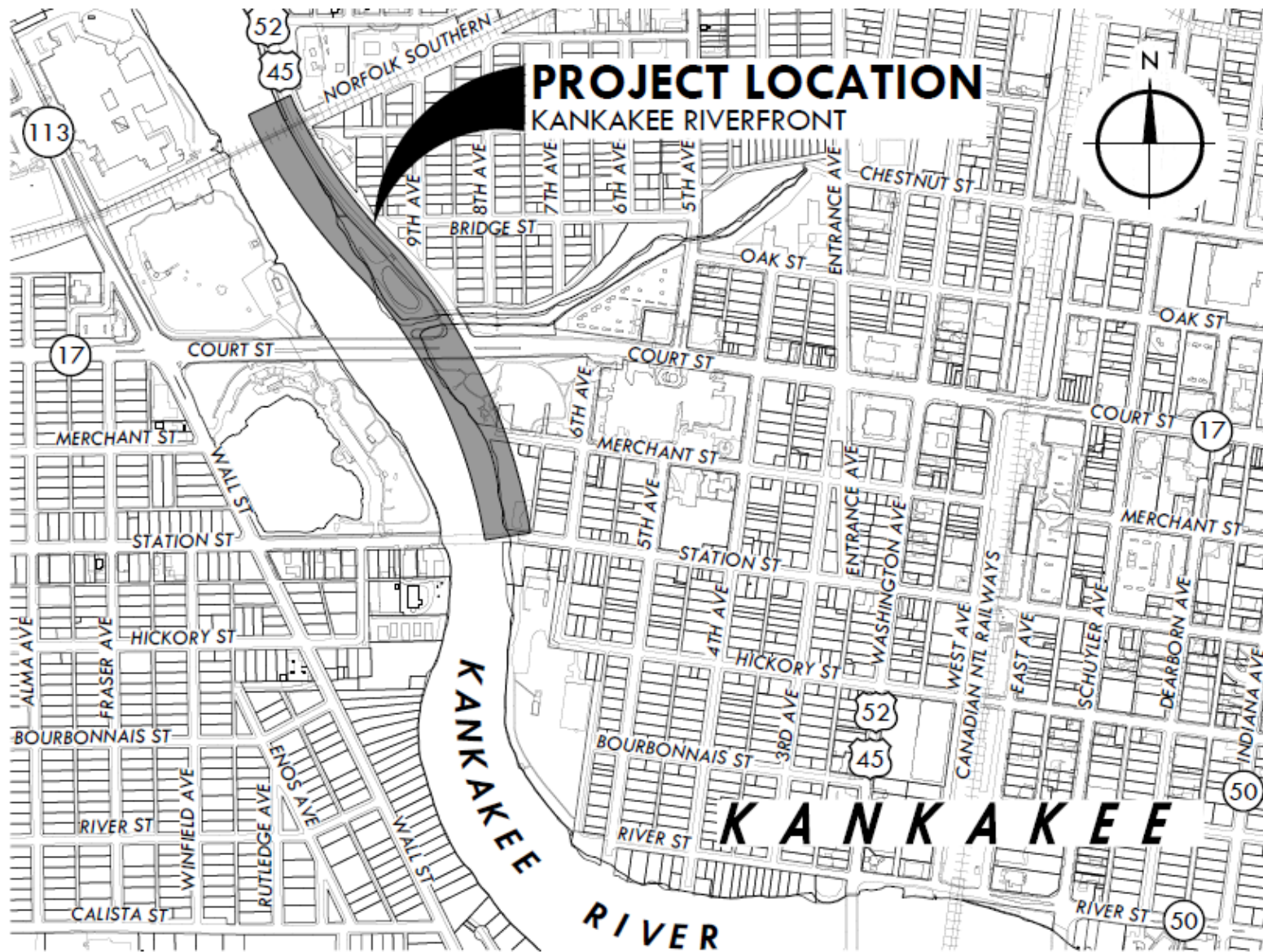

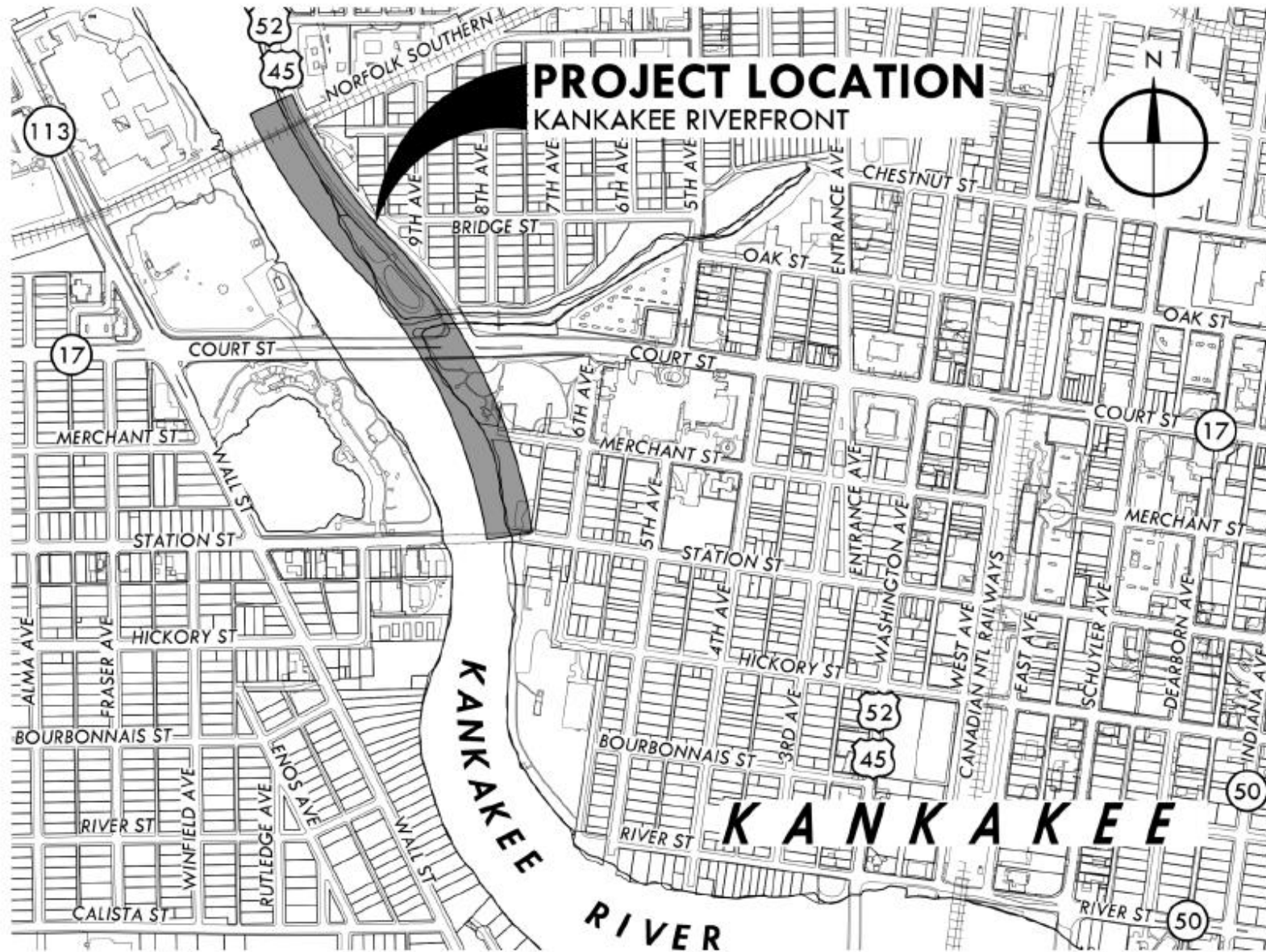
